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WHY

The report on Mapping of Law Enforcement Training in the European Union indicates that, in 85% of the Member States, Law Enforcement Agencies are involved in transfer of knowledge and their main needs relate to mission preparation training in order to ensure that law enforcement officials operating under the EU framework have common competencies and bring aligned, common EU content and values to the countries to where the EU deploys the missions.

The 2013 CSDP Lessons Report indicates police and rule of law staff may be very competent in their own profession but they are not always aware of the mentoring and advising techniques that follow EU good practices and are necessary for the training and capacity building of mission beneficiaries. Furthermore, they often have different approaches to such training and capacity building based on their respective national traditions.

LET4CAP overall objective is that of contributing – through training interventions - towards a more consistent and efficient assistance in law enforcement capacity building to third countries.

WHAT

LET4CAP aims to contribute to the harmonization of a training package for LEOs and to the development of a common law enforcement capacity building culture.

The project will develop a training package that aims at:

- 1) Building skills related to managing complex situations within pluralistic cultures and deeply divided societies;
- 2) Building a specific set of skills to transfer their knowledge to their national counterparts to ensure sustainability;
- 3) Strengthening linguistic and communication abilities necessary to operate in international environments and within different cultural/social contexts;
- 4) Providing a solid knowledge base on European good practices and values.

FOR WHOM

The project's beneficiaries are:

- Short/Medium-term: Law Enforcement Officers (LEOs) and Law Enforcement Agencies' trainers from EU member States.
- Medium/Long-term: training providers, EU relevant institutions and agencies working on LE capacity building in third countries and EU member States seconding personnel for such task.

HOW

LET4CAP is organized in four main components (WP):

- **Stocktaking** of existing good practices and lessons.
- Development of the **training course curriculum** (*Issue area; learning objectives with respect to knowledge, skills and attitudes; content; training methods; timeline; evaluation of training and assessment of participants*).
- **Piloting Training implementation** (blended training).
- **Other dissemination & outreach** activities.

The **project** will produce a number of outputs to support law enforcement capacity building, such as: 1 **Compendium of POLICY GUIDANCE**, standards, good practices and lessons learned, 1 **INVENTORY** of existing training curricula and courses, 1 **SYLLABUS** for a Law enforcement capacity building training course, 4 in person Training courses, 10 country **BOOKLETS**, 1 Distance learning training course.
